


Totus Tuus~Save the Date!


Baby Bottle Campaign 2024

Easter Season

Did You Know

While the secular world moves on from bunnies and chocolate, the Catholic Church continues to celebrate Easter long after the final ham leftovers are eaten. The Easter season is the second-longest liturgical season. Only ordinary time is longer. The Church celebrates the Easter season (also known as "Eastertide") for 50 days, culminating with the feast of Pentecost, where Scripture (Acts 2:1-31) tells us that the Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles. There are two holy days of obligation during the Easter season, Divine Mercy Sunday (April 7) and the Ascension (May 9). Here are some Easter Prayers you could use for this Easter season. Jelly Bean Prayer: Red is for the blood you gave, and black is for the empty grave. Yellow is for the shining sun, white is for the new life begun. Green is for the grass and trees and purple is for your majesty. Orange is for the edge of night, and pink is for the morning light. Amen! Blessed are you, O Mary, silent witness of Easter! You, O Mother of the Crucified One now risen, who at the hour of pain and death kept the flame of hope burning, teach us also to be, amongst the

incongruities of passing time, convinced and joyful witnesses of the eternal message of live and love brought to the world by the Risen Redeemer. Pope John Paul II, 2004

Did you know your child can attend a Catholic School? Tuition assistance scholarship grants from the endowment fund established as a result of the Diocese of Peoria ROOTED IN FAITH Campaign and named in honor of Archbishop Spalding, the first Bishop of Peoria, will be available for the 2024-2025 school year for students enrolled in or intending to enroll in grades Kindergarten through 12 in any Catholic school located in the Diocese of Peoria whose families are active members of a Catholic parish in the diocese. All grants will be based on financial need objectively assessed. Information about the grants and applications materials may be obtained from any Catholic elementary or secondary school in the Diocese of Peoria or on the Diocesan website www.cdop.org under Catholic Education and then under Financial **Assistance.** Consult the detailed protocols and procedures and checklist for all requirements necessary to be eligible for an award.
